Highway-Adam Reid

The Village of Gowanda hired Travis Moore as part time as needed employee for highway back in June. With winter approaching he will be called upon to plow.

Fire-Carol Sheibley

The fire department received grant money for turn out gear.

Motion 10-85-Motion by Trustee Koch, seconded by Trustee Sheibley to approve the purchase of fire protective turn out gear as invoiced utilizing grant funds. Motion carried.

Motion 10-86-Motion by Trustee Sisti, seconded by Trustee Koch to accept the American Legion donation for the learn to ski program of \$1,200.00. Motion carried.

Treasurer-Traci Hopkins

Motion 10-87-Motion by Trustee Zimmermann, seconded by Trustee Koch to approve WWTP pay app #16 to STC Construction through 8/31/25 at \$282,665.85. Motion carried.

Motion 10-88-Motion by Trustee Zimmermann, seconded by Trustee Sheibley to approve WWTP pay app #17 to STC Construction through 9/30/25 at \$80,385.20. Motion carried.

Motion 10-89-Motion by Trustee Koch, seconded by Trustee Sheibley to approve WWTP pay app #6 to BECC Electric through 8/31/25 and #7 through 9/30/25 at \$16,902.87. Motion carried.

Motion 10-90-Motion by Trustee Sisti, seconded by Trustee Zimmermann to approve WWTP pay app #4 to Quackenbush through 8/31/25 at \$8,159.31. Motion carried.

The Point Peter BAN renewal

Motion 10-91-Motion by Trustee Sheibley, seconded by Trustee Koch to approve the 2025 BAN Renewal at \$1,925,000.00. Motion carried.

NY Forward Grant Contracting-The Village was awarded \$989,000 for a streetscape project. The DOT has a big road project they are doing in 2027. The Village would like to combine the projects with a betterment agreement. This will help the Village out. The DOT is sending their bids out in December, awarding bids in February 2027, Spring 2027 start date, and completion by December 2027. The Village has 3 options to choose from with DOT.

1. Betterment agreement with DOT and Village would have the DOT add the Village project to their project and the Village will need to provide all funds to the DOT upfront by September 2026. The Village would have to borrow the money to pay DOT and would likely have to wait until December 2027 to see the first reimbursement. This option would include estimate \$60,000-\$70,000 interest payment. Also, any bidding cost escalation would be the Villages responsibility. A Betterment will allow the DOT to absorb all design and engineering expenses to allow 100% of funding to provide for construction activity.
2. The DOT could establish an MOU directly with the DOS and sub-allocate NY Forward funding to DOT directly. The Village would also have to establish a betterment agreement with DOT to cover any cost over runs. The Village could reduce the need to borrow with this option, but would be responsible for all design and engineering fees, reducing the project impact.
3. The Village does not work with the DOT and sub-contracts with an engineering firm to design, bid, and coordinate the project.

The Village board desires to maximize the project funding and agree with Option 1, pending further communication with DOT regarding the design and engineering cost to also potentially be included in Option 2. Further information will be gathered.

A budget amendment was provided to the board for approval for the water fund for Point Peter.

Motion 10-92-Motion by Trustee Sisti, seconded by Trustee Zimmermann to approve budget amendment #1. Motion carried.

Budget Modification #1 was provided to the board for approval for the police car from personnel line.

Motion 10-93-Motion by Sisti, seconded by Trustee Sisti to approve budget modification #1. Motion carried.

The abstract bills to pay was provided to the board for approval.

Motion 10-94-Motion by Trustee Sheibley, seconded by Trustee Sisti to approve the abstract bills to pay for General \$171,594.76, Water \$27,972.97, Sewer \$16,746.35, Capital Projects \$464,866.89, and Community Development Special Projects \$101,039.08. Motion carried.
